This 501c3 organization accepted grant applications from charitable organizations and governmental entities during the month of August. Several local organizations applied for funding.

You can use the interest from the Donor-Advised Fund you establish to address the issues and needs you care about most. Your recommendations are submitted to the FSACF board for approval and your grant dollars will be awarded.
- Field of Interest Funds. You can target your gift to address needs in an area of community life that is important to you: arts. aging, at-risk youth, etc. You identify your personal interest area when establishing your endowed fund and the interest from it will be granted to organizations targeting that cause.
